He attained the rank of Sergeant and was the recipient of the Purple Heart, two Bronze Stars, Distinguished Service Medal, and Vietnam Service Medal. He has been a Life Member of VFW Post 2230 since 1970 and awarded Life Membership in Vietnam Veterans of America. He is also the Past Commander of New Jersey's VFW District #5. We veterans are proud to serve under Commander Jeans and he is so deserving of this honor."
